LEADING LEADING OFF: Today the Angels play the final contest of a 10-game road trip (4-5) to **Oakland** (3-0), **Minnesota** (0-3) and **Chicago White Sox** (1-2)...Halos have dropped five of six games since a four-game win streak (April 10-13)...LAA opens a six-game home stand tomorrow vs. **Seattle** (April 22-24) and **Kansas City** (April 25-27)...**Angels are 5-2 vs. A.L. West (1-7 vs. rest of MLB).**

FAST FACTS: Today marks the ninth time in 16 games the Halos will face a left-handed starter...Club is 4-4 in previous matchups...**Nick Tropeano** takes the ball for the Angels tomorrow vs. **Seattle**...Dating back to last season, he is 3-0 with a 0.83 ERA (21.2 IP – 2 ER) in his last four starts...In his career, he is 5-2 with a 2.62 ERA (44.2 IP – 13 ER) against A.L. West foes.

LEAVE IT TO WEAVER: In 13 career starts against the **White Sox**, **Jered Weaver** is 10-2 with a 1.99 ERA (86 IP – 19 ER)...**Weaver has won each of his last six starts vs. CWS**...He is 5-1 with a 2.79 ERA (38.2 IP – 12 ER) at U.S. Cellular Field.

OFFENSIVE STRUGGLES: LAA has plated one run in the last 19 innings...Yesterday Angels were held to one run, fifth time in 15 games scoring one or fewer runs...Offense has been limited to four runs or less in 12 of 15 games...Club has plated 44 runs (28th in MLB) in the 15 games (2.9 per)... Halos have hit second-fewest HRs (6) in MLB (ATL; 3) and .302 team SLG pct. ranks last in A.L. (29th in MLB).

VS. DANKS: Some Halos with success against veteran **John Danks**...**Escobar** (.429; 6/14); **Giavotella** (.357; 5/14); **Pujols** (.300; 3/10, 1 HR).

SIMMONS STREAK SNAPPED: **Andrelton Simmons** saw his career-best hit streak snapped at 12 games yesterday (0/4)...**Marks longest streak in MLB this season**...Batted .313 (15/48) during the stretch.

ALBERT ASCENDING: With the 562nd HR of his career Sunday, **Albert Pujols** moved one HR shy of matching **Reggie Jackson** (563) for 13th all-time...**Pujols' 585 doubles** are one away from **Rafael Palmeiro** for 18th all-time.

@ WHITE SOX: Halos have won eight of last nine meetings at home vs. CWS but have dropped seven of last 10 in Chicago...Angels were swept in a three-game series in last visit (Aug. 10-12, 2015) to U.S. Cellular...LAA has slightest lead in all-time series with White Sox at 360-358-1.

MARINERS ON DECK: Halos claimed 2015 series 12-7 (7-2 at home)...**Angels are 78-55 over M's since 2009**...In 18 games vs. Seattle in 2015, **Trout** hit .338 (24/71) with six home runs and 12 RBI.

BATTER BITS: **Kole Calhoun** has hits in 11 of first 15 games this season (.315; 17/54)...**Yunel Escobar** has hits in seven of 10 games and has reached base 23 times in first 15 games...Since 2009, **Cliff Pennington** is batting .375 (18/48) at U.S. Cellular Field.

TAKE IT TO THE STREET: **Huston Street** (318th career save Tuesday) has tied **Rick Aguilera** for 19th on all-time saves list. **Todd Jones** ranks 18th with 319 career saves.

RUN WITH THIS: **Trout** has scored 457 runs over the last four years (2012-15), no other player has more than 384 in the span (FSW/STATS).

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR: The Angels roster features eight players from different countries and territories this season: United States, Cuba, Curacao, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico, South Korea and Venezuela.

THIS N' THAT: In his last outing Saturday, **Weaver** recorded 1,500th career strikeout, just third player in Angels franchise history to reach the mark, trailing only **Chuck Finley (2,151)** and **Nolan Ryan (2,416)**...On April 11th, **Mike Trout** hit the 140th HR of his career to become one of just three players all-time to reach 140 HR & 100 SB prior to age-25 season (**Alex Rodriguez** and **Andruw Jones**)...**Pujols** eclipsed **Babe Ruth** (37 years and 127 days in 1932) to become the third youngest major leaguer to record at least 550 homers and 1,700 RBI when he drove in his 1,700th run at the age of 36 years and 84 days on April 9.

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (17 straight years with Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia A's) (STATS LLC)...**Scioscia's** current .546 (1,422-1185) winning percentage and 1,422 wins are both tops in franchise history...He ranks 24th on the all-time win list (59 victories behind **Earl Weaver** for 23rd).

FAST FACT: Just three players in Major League history have started their career with 25+ HR and 100+ runs scored in each of their first four MLB seasons (STATS LLC):

HARDWARE EVERYWHERE: During Opening Week several Angels received awards from the 2015 campaign...**Andrelton Simmons** was presented with his **Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award**... **Mike Trout** received his 2015 **Silver Slugger Award**...He has won the award in each of the last four seasons and joins Hall-of-Famer **Mike Piazza** as the only players to win a Silver Slugger in each of their first four full Major League seasons...**Kole Calhoun** was presented with his 2015 **RAWLINGS Gold Glove Award**...He is the first Angels player to win a Gold Glove since shortstop **Erick Aybar** in 2011.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

April 21

(2000) Angels collected three home runs in an inning twice (4th & 9th inn.) at Tampa Bay, first time it occurred twice in one game in MLB history...Halos also tied MLB record with three players hitting two-or-more home runs in the same game (**Mo Vaughn**, **Tim Salmon** & **Troy Glaus**).

April 22

(2014) **Albert Pujols** became the first player in MLB history to hit the 499th and 500th home runs of his career in the same game. He became the 26th member of the 500 home run club with his fifth inning two-run shot at Nationals Park.

In last six starts vs. White Sox, is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA (38.1 IP – 10 ER)

- Making third start of the regular season and second on the road.
- **CATCHING THE EXPRESS:** With victory on April 10 vs. Texas, Weaver (139 wins) passed **Nolan Ryan** (138) for second place on the Angels all-time wins list...**Chuck Finley** is the Angels all-time leader with 165 wins.
- **1500 K's:** Recorded the 1500th strikeout of his career in last start on April 16 at Minnesota (**Miguel Sano** swinging in 3rd inning)...Became third player to record 1500 strikeouts in an Angels uniform, joining **Nolan Ryan** and **Chuck Finley**...Is one of six active pitchers to record 1500 strikeouts while pitching exclusively for one franchise in their career (**Matt Cain, Felix Hernandez, Clayton Kershaw, Tim Lincecum** and **Justin Verlander**).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start Saturday at Minnesota after allowing four earned runs on eight hits with two walks and one strikeout in 4.1 innings pitched.
- **VS. WHITE SOX:** In 13 career starts against the White Sox, owns a 10-2 record and 1.99 ERA (86 IP – 19 ER)... **Since 2000, leads the Majors with a 1.99 ERA vs. Chicago-A.L. (min. 10 starts)**...In six starts vs. White Sox since 2011, is 6-0 with 2.35 ERA (38.1 IP – 10 ER)...Streak of six consecutive winning starts vs. White Sox is longest in Angels history and longest by any Major Leaguer since a seven game streak by **Justin Verlander** from 2009-11.
- **AT U.S. CELLULAR FIELD:** In six career starts at U.S. Cellular Field, is 5-1 with a 2.79 ERA (38.2 IP – 12 ER)...Today marks second start at the ballpark since 2011.
- **VS. A.L. CENTRAL:** In 77 career games against A.L. Central opponents, is 41-19 with a 3.37 ERA (483.2 IP – 181 ER)...The .683 winning percentage ranks fifth all-time against the division (min. 50 decisions), behind **David Wells** (.58-12, .829), **Roy Halladay** (40-14, .741), **Roger Clemens** (57-23, .713) and **Max Scherzer** (41-18, .683).
- **NO PLACE LIKE HOME:** Since 2009, leads the American League with a 2.41 ERA (706.1 IP – 189 ER) at home (min. 300 IP)...Only **Clayton Kershaw's** 1.97 home ERA (808.2 IP – 177 ER) is lower in the Majors.
- **WINNING THE WEST:** Owns a 48-34 career record and 3.19 ERA (737.1 IP – 261 ER) against A.L. West opponents...Since 2006, the 48 wins vs. A.L. West clubs rank second to **Felix Hernandez** (55).
- **WEAVE DON'T WALK:** Walked one-or-fewer batters in 16 of his 26 starts last season...**His 11 starts with no walks in 2015 were second most in A.L.**
- **CAREER NOTES:** Has compiled a career regular season 139-81 record with 13 complete games, seven shutouts and a 3.41 ERA...Owns the top winning percentage in franchise history at **.632 (min. 100 decisions)**.
- **ANGELS ALL-TIME RANKINGS:** Ranks second on the Angels all-time list in wins (139) and starts (293), is third in strikeouts (1500) and is fourth all-time in innings pitched (1857.1).
