METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 8-9 in July...New York is 15-36 in its last 51 contests...The Mets have gone 17 straight series without a series victory dating to their sweep of Arizona from May 18-20 at Citi Field...New York has 13 wins in its last at-bat, tied for the third-most in the majors.

AT HOME: New York is 5-7 in their last 12 home games and 7-22 in their last 29 home games...Overall, the Mets are 19-33 at home this year, the worst winning percentage (.365) in the National League.

VS. LEFTIES: The Mets are scheduled to face three lefthanded starters in this series...This is the second time this year that the Mets have faced three lefthanded starters in a three-game series (also: June 22-24 vs. Los Angeles Dodgers - Alex Wood, Clayton Kershaw and Rich Hill)...The Mets actually faced four straight lefthanded starters (Colorado's Kyle Freeman started on June 21)...The Mets are 9-16 vs. lefthanded starters this year.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 5-for-10 (.500) with four RBI in three games since the All-Star break...Over his last seven games, Conforto is hitting .364 (8-22) with two home runs, seven RBI, six runs scored and a .483 OBP...Conforto has a 15.0 % walk-rate, the eighth-best in the majors.

OUCH: Brandon Nimmo was hit by a pitch last night and has been hit 16 times this year, extending his single-season franchise record...Lucas Duda held the old mark getting hit 14 times in 2015...Nimmo leads the majors in HBP.

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo has a career-high 13 homers... He is 14th in the NL with a .375 on-base percentage, 15th with a .859 OPS and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Is one home run shy of 339 for his career, which would tie him for 99th place on major league baseball's all-time home run list with Dave Parker, Boog Powell and Tino Martinez...In addition, His 35 walks since May 24 are the fifth-most in the National League in that time and are the seventh-most in the majors.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Had 52 RBI prior to the All-Star break, the most first-half RBI in his career...Cabrera also has 17 homers, already the third-most in his career (25 in 2011 and 23 in 2016)... His 17 homers are the most by a Mets second baseman prior to the All-Star break.

MORE CABBY NOTES: Since June 16, Cabrera is hitting .295 (33-112) with six homers, 17 RBI, 14 walks, 15 runs scored and a .373 OBP...Cabrera's 38 extra-base hits are tied for the second-most among major league second basemen, trailing Ozzie Albies (52).

WILMER FLORES: Is batting .292 (49-168) with 13 doubles, six home runs, 25 RBI, 17 runs scored and 13 walks in his last 51 games dating to May 4...He owns a franchise-record 10 career walk-off RBI.

PADRES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 11-9 vs. the Padres at Citi Field since 2012.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



WHEELZ UP: Zack Wheeler has posted a 2.78 ERA (14 earned runs/45.1 innings) over his last seven home starts...Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 13 of his 18 starts this season, including 11 of his last 14 starts...Over his last seven starts, he has a 3.49 ERA (15 earned runs/38.2 innings).

ROBERT GSELLMAN: Notched his fifth save of the year on Friday and his second straight six-out save (also: July 13 vs. Washington)...Prior to this year his only other professional save came in 2011 for the rookie-level Gulf Coast Mets in his first pro outing.

SETH LUGO: Has allowed six earned runs in his 33.2 innings in relief (1.60 ERA) dating to May 1 and three earned runs in his last 15.1 relief innings (1.76 ERA)...Lugo is holding lefties to a .182 (22-121) batting average.

IN THE MINORS: LHP Anthony Kay, the Mets first-round pick in 2016, tossed 6.0 innings and didn't allow an earned run for St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League last night vs. Clearwater... Kay has posted a 1.42 ERA (four earned runs/25.1 innings) in four starts for St. Lucie...He is 6-6 with a 3.71 ERA (39 earned runs/94.2 innings) and 97 strikeouts in 17 combined starts with Columbia (A) of the South Atlantic League and St. Lucie.

HEART & HUSTLE AWARD: Brandon Nimmo is the Mets Heart & Hustle Award recipient...The Award is given out annually by the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association to a player who not only excels on the field, but also best embodies the values, spirits and traditions of baseball...The Heart and Hustle Award is the only MLB award voted on by former players...Former players from each of the 30 clubs select one player from each team...The final winner will be announced on November 8, 2018 at the 19th Annual Legends for Youth Dinner in New York City.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 7.2 innings, allowing four runs, earned, on eight hits in the Mets' 7-4 victory over the Nationals while walking two and fanning seven...Was his longest start since his shutout at Miami on June 19, 2014... Snapped a streak of 13-straight winless starts without a win, earning his first victory since April 29...That was the longest winless streak by a Mets pitcher since Masato Yoshii went 14 straight starts without earning a win in 1998.

VS. SAN DIEGO: Wheeler today faces the Padres for the second time this season and fifth time in his career...Earned the win in the Mets' 14-2 victory on April 29 vs. San Diego...In that start, Wheeler threw 5.0 innings, giving up two runs, earned, on six hits while walking two and fanning a season-high-tying nine batters...Also struck out a career-high 12 Padres on August 15, 2013 at Petco Park...Wheeler lost his only previous start against the club at home with (four earned runs/5.0 innings).

AT CITI: The Mets have won Wheeler's last two home starts at Citi Field after losing his first eight of the season...Is 1-2 with a 2.78 ERA (14 earned runs/45.1 innings) over his last seven home starts...Overall, Wheeler is 1-5 with a 4.55 ERA (31 earned runs/61.1 innings) in 10 starts at home this season...In 40-career home starts, Wheeler is 9-20 with a 4.80 ERA (120 earned runs/225.0 innings)...Has fanned 222 and walked 100 batters at home.

QUALITY WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 13 of his 18 starts this season, including 11 of his last 14...Five of his last nine starts have been quality outings...Has nine quality starts overall after posting six quality starts in 17 outings in all of 2017...However, the Mets have as many wins (three) in his 13 starts of 6.0 or more innings than they do in his five starts of fewer than 6.0 innings.

IN THE (STRIKE) ZONE: Threw a first-pitch strike to 28 of the 32 (87.5 percent) batters he faced in his last start...This season, has begun a career-high 64.8 percent of his opponents' plate appearances with a first-pitch strike, the ninth-highest rate in the NL...From 2013-2017, Wheeler threw a first-pitch strike to 55.2 percent of the batters he faced...His first-pitch strike percentage has risen every season in his career (52.0 in 2013, 54.4 in 2014, 60.6 in 2017 and 64.8 this season)...Also ranks ninth in the NL in O-Swing percentage (opponents swing at 32.7 percent of his pitches outside the strikezone) and has the league's 11th-highest Z-Swing percentage (opponents swing at 68.3 percent of his pitches in the strikezone).

JULY: Wheeler will be making his 18th-career start in the month of July...In 17-career July starts, he is 7-2 with a 3.13 ERA (35 earned runs/100.2 innings)... Earned his seventh-career July win in his last outing...Those seven wins are his most in any single calendar month.

CAREER-BEST STRIKEOUT PACE: Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.61 K/9 ratio (458 strikeouts/479.0 innings)...In his 18 starts this season, he is striking out batters at a rate of 8.89 K/9 (106 strikeouts/107.1 innings)...Has whiffed at least seven batters in 10 starts this season, including five of his last six outings (career-high is 13 such games in 2014).

BY INNING: This season, Wheeler has a 5.50 ERA (11 earned runs/18.0 innings) in the opening frame...From the second inning onward, his ERA is 4.23 (42 earned runs/89.1 innings)...Wheeler has a 4.93 career ERA (46 earned runs/84.0 innings) in the first inning...Owns a 3.83 career ERA (168 earned runs/395.0 innings) in all subsequent innings.

PRESENT VS. PAST: Wheeler's start today will be his 19th of the season, a mark he has reached once before in his major league career (2014)...Made 17 starts in 2013 and 2017...Through 18 starts this season, Wheeler has thrown 107.1 innings, (had 101.2 innings in his first 18 starts in 2014)...Has a 1.34 WHIP and 4.44 ERA in 107.1 innings in 18 starts this season...In his 17 starts last season, had a 1.59 WHIP and a 5.21 ERA in 86.1 innings.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP COREY OSWALT (0-2, 5.64)

LAST START: Made his fourth-career MLB start (fifth appearance) against the Nationals at Citi Field on July 15...Pitched 5.0 innings, allowing one run, earned, on two hits with no walks and one strikeout in the Mets' 6-1 setback...Became the first Mets pitcher to allow two or fewer hits in 5.0 or more innings in consecutive starts since Noah Syndergaard did so in consecutive starts August 21 and 27, 2016.

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has made 10 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 5.32 ERA (28 earned runs/47.1 innings)...Has 49 strikeouts and 18 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 26 at St. Louis.

- Has hit safely in seven of his last eight games vs. the Padres (.375, 12-32) with four doubles, one homer, six RBI and eight runs scored dating to July 24, 2017.
- Is hitting .200 (6-30) with two doubles, one homer and two RBI in his last 10 games...Was 27-82 (.329) in 20 games prior.
- Is averaging a home run once every 25.22 at-bats as a Met...This season he is hitting a home run once every 21.29 at-bats, which would be the best rate of his career for a single-season (homered every 22.65 at-bats in 2016, his first season with the Mets).
