THE TWINS: The Twins will begin their second road trip of the season tonight in New York...the Twins finished their homestand 2-4, taking two of three from the Angels and getting swept by the Rangers...following the four game series with the Yankees, the Twins will travel to Tampa for a three-game series with the Rays, April 20-22.

TWINS DROP ANOTHER GAME TO TEXAS: The Twins lost to the Rangers yesterday by a score of 4-3...Liam Hendriks was the starter but did not factor into the decision as he worked 6.0 innings allowing just one run on seven hits...he struck out four and didn't walk a batter...Glen Perkins (0-1) suffered the loss as he allowed three runs on two hits (one home run) without retiring a batter...the Twins scattered seven hits including two from Denard Span (2-for-4) and Jamey Carroll (2-for-4)...Clete Thomas made his Twins debut and homered in his second at-bat...former Twin Joe Nathan recorded the save for the Rangers.

SWEPT BY TEXAS: The Twins were swept for the second time this season with the loss yesterday to Texas (also swept in Baltimore, April 6-8)...in 2011, they were swept a total of 14 times (1 one-game series, 3 two-game series, 9 three-game series and 1 four-game series)...the 14 sweeps were the most of a Twins team since the 1978 team was swept 17 times.

THE HAMMER HAS GONE STREAKING: Josh Willingham has hit safely in each of the Twins nine games this season, going 13-for-31...in fact, his .419 average is the third highest in the Majors entering play today (Kemp .487 & D. Ortiz .444) while his 1.384 OPS is second in baseball (Kemp 1.548)...additionally, the last Twins player to record a hit in each of the first nine games was when Jacque Jones started the 2002 season hitting in 11 straight...Kirby Puckett owns the Twins record hitting safely in each of the Twins first 15 games in 1994...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last Twins player making his debut with a streak as long, was when Orlando Cabrera hit in his first 11 games as a Twin, August 1-13, 2009.

THE TABLE SETTER - SPAN APPROACH: Denard Span is hitting .389 in nine games this season...in 39 plate appearances he has swung at the first pitch just once...of those 39 plate appearances, he has taken the first pitch for a strike 24 times but is hitting .429 with an 0-1 count...of his 14 hits this season, five have gone for extra-bases and he has a .991 OPS.

LIMITING THE WALKS - THROWING STRIKES: The Twins walked just one batter yesterday and walked just three batters during the three game series with the Rangers...on the season, the Twins have walked just 19 batters, tied with the Phillies for the fewest walks in baseball...the Twins staff is averaging just 134.4 pitches per game, the second lowest in baseball...only the Cardinals (130.3) are averaging fewer.

BRONX-ITIS: Since Ron Gardenhire was named manager in 2002, the Twins have posted a record of 18-51 against the Yankees, including a road record of 5-28...they went 3-25 in New York, May 17, 2002-May 15, 2010 but in the last five games (since May 16, 2010) the Twins have gone 2-3 in New York, scoring 21 runs (Yankees - 21), recording 42 hits (Yankees - 44), making two errors (Yankees - 3) and leaving 33 men on base (Yankees - 35).

M & M BOYS IN NYC: Joe Mauer enters today with a career batting average of .316 (12-for-38) with three home runs, eight rbi and nine walks in 10 career regular season games in new Yankee Stadium...Justin Morneau is batting .459 (17-for-37) with five doubles, four home runs and six rbi in 10 career regular season games in new Yankee Stadium...furthermore, Mauer is batting .419 (13-for-31) with five doubles, two home runs, five rbi, four walks and just one strikeout off Yankees starter Freddy Garcia.

THIS AND THAT:

- Joe Mauer has 1,104 career hits, moving him within two hits of tying Michael Cuddyer (1,106) for 10th on the Twins All-Time list...Mauer has hit in each of his last five games, batting .333 (7-for-21) in that span.
- Denard Span has reached base via hit or walk in eight of nine games played this season and 11 times in his last 19 plate appearances...he has an extra-base hit in four straight games.
- The Twins are hitting .220 (15-for-68) with runners in scoring position this season and are 0-for-7 with the bases loaded.
