THE LATEST: Tonight, Angels play the seventh game of a 10-game (3-3) home stand vs. Seattle (1-2), Cleveland (2-1) and Tampa Bay (8/16-19)...**Last night's win gave Halos their first series victory since July 23-25 vs. KC...**Halos plated 19 runs in the three games vs. Cleveland...Club has won consecutive games for first time this month...Halos are 2-4-1 in last seven series...LAA has dropped five of eight...**Angels sit -1.5 games back of Wild Card pace...Angels are 14-18 since the All-Star break and 5-9 in August...**After an 8-15 April, Halos are 54-41 since (18-21 since July 1)...Following this home stand, Angels travel to Boston (Aug. 21-23) and Detroit (Aug. 24-25)...Halos have yet to face Red Sox in 2012...**Following the trip, 19 of club's next 25 games will be at Angel Stadium.**

2002 CHAMPIONSHIP ANNIVERSARY: The Angels are honoring the 10th anniversary of the 2002 World Series Championship as the team currently hosts "Anniversary Week". Scheduled festivities include honorary first pitches, special promotions & giveaways, autograph signings and the induction of the 2002 club into the Angels Hall of Fame...**Tonight's honorary first pitch will be thrown by 2002 World Series Game 6 hero Scott Spiezio...**Following the broadcast of Saturday's game vs. Tampa Bay, Fox Sports West will air a re-broadcast of Game 7 from the 2002 World Series.

Vs. TAMPA BAY: Rays lead 2012 series 5-1...Halos were shutout at home in each of last two games vs. TB (have been held scoreless in last 23 innings vs. Rays)...Rays have won eight of last nine games vs. Angels...LAA has totaled just eight runs in six games vs. Rays this season, batting .199 (37/186) and .114 (4/35) w/ RISP...Angels are 36-15 in last 51 home games vs. Rays but 12-18 in last 30 contests in St. Pete.

PITCHING STRUGGLES: After logging a team ERA of 3.33 from May-June, Angels have posted a 5.08 ERA (350.2 IP – 198 ER) since July 1...**This month, LAA has a 6.11 ERA (123.2 IP – 84 ER)**...Bullpen has a 6.35 ERA (85 IP – 60 ER) in 32 games since the All-Star Break (3.16 ERA in 86 G before ASB).

25 for 12: With his 25th HR Monday night, Albert Pujols became just the ninth player in MLB history to hit 25-or-more HRs in 12 consecutive seasons: Ruth (15), Bonds (15), Mays (13), ARod (13), Gehrig (12), Foxx (12), Sosa (12), Manny (12)...Pujols is the only player to hit 30+ HR in each of his first 11 seasons.

ELIAS SAYS: Since Pujols hit his first HR on May 6th, he leads MLB in homers since that date (26) and his 77 RBI over that span rank second in MLB to Miguel Cabrera (81).

MOE FROM ELIAS: Mike Trout hit his 22nd home run and stole his 38th base last night. It was the fifth time in 2012 he has recorded a homer and a steal. That ties Don Baylor (1978) for third-most in Halos history behind Bobby Bonds (7 in 1977) and Chone Figgins (6 in 2006).

OFFENSE (2012 vs. 2011): LAA has 10 or more hits in 58 games (56 such games in '11)...Club ranks third in MLB in '12 batting .272 (club hit .253 in 2011)...LAA has 145 HRs in 2012 (totaled 155 HRs in 2011)...**2012 Halos are on pace to score 750+ runs - 2011 Angels plated 667 runs (lowest total in 19 seasons)**...Angels have a +44 run differential (totaled a +34 differential in 2011).

KNOW THIS: Trout is currently leading the A.L. in average (.340) and stolen bases (38)...Only two players (one rookie) in the last 63 years have led a league in both categories: Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 (.350, 56) and Jackie Robinson in 1949 (.342, 37)...The rookie also lead the Majors with 93 runs scored.

THIS N' THAT: Kendrys Morales has launched six home runs his last 14 games and 11 of his last 21 hits have gone for extra-bases...Halo batters have hit 30 home runs over their last 16 games...15 shutouts by Angel pitchers are most by the franchise since 20 SHO by the 1989 team...Trout has swiped 29 consecutive stolen bases to set a new club record previously held by Gary Pettis (1985, 22 straight) and was last caught stealing 6/4 vs. Seattle...The last rookie with 29 or more consecutive successful stolen bases was Jimmy Rollins (35 straight in 2001)...Only two AL players since 2000 have had single-season stolen base streaks reach at least 30: Ichiro Suzuki (39 in 2006) and Carl Crawford (30 in 2009).

30 HR TANDEM: Angels have had multiple players hit at least 30 HR in a season on four occasions:
2000: Troy Glaus (47), Mo Vaughn (36), Garret Anderson (35), Tim Salmon (34)
1995: Tim Salmon (34), Jim Edmonds (33) **1982:** Reggie Jackson (39), Doug DeCinces (30)
1979: Don Baylor (36), Bobby Grich (30) **** 2012: Trumbo (29), Pujols (26), Trout (22)**

ROOK OF AGES: No player in MLB history has hit .340 with 20 home runs and 40 stolen bases in a single season (ESPN STATS)...Trout is currently batting .340 with 22 HR and 38 SB...The rookie leads the A.L. in AVG, SBs and RUNS (93)...With his 20th HR on his 21st birthday (Aug. 7), he became the youngest player in MLB history to have 20 HR/20 SB and youngest player in history to have a 20 HR/30 SB campaign...LAA was 6-14 when Trout joined team on April 28th, LAA is 56-42 since...Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23) which tied the modern MLB rookie record and set a new A.L. rookie mark...Streak also established Angels' franchise record...He leads A.L. rookies in nearly every offensive category and MLB rookies in most as well...Trout is averaging 0.96 runs per game and has scored a run 45% of the time he has reached base...**BEFORE AUG. 1:** Trout became second player in MLB history to hit .350 or above with at least 15 HR and 30 SB before Aug. 1 (ended month at .353 with 18 HRs and 31 SBs)...Rickey Henderson (1985) is only other player to do so (.352, 16 HR, 47 SBs)...**AFTER 81 GAMES PLAYED:** In his first 81 games, Trout scored 80 runs...With 55 RBI, combined for 135 runs plated in 81 games...The last rookie to do this was Joe DiMaggio (87, 83) in 1936 (ELIAS)...Only one other player since 1920 has had as many hits (116), RBI (55) and SBs (31) in his first 81 games of a season as Trout has had through his first 81 - George Sisler in 1922 (ELIAS)...**PLAYER OF MONTH:** Trout (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month for July, the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in same month...Marked his third consecutive monthly rookie honor.

(2008) John Lackey earns his 10th win of the season giving the Angels five starters with 10-or-more victories for the first time in club history; (2009) The Angels set a club record for runs in an extra-inning with nine in the 13th in the 17-8 win at Baltimore.

Victorious in three of last four home starts

- Took the loss in last start, August 11th vs. Seattle, allowing seven runs (five earned) over just 3.1 innings pitched...First loss since July 3rd marked his shortest outing since Sept. 9, 2003 vs. Colorado (3 IP in rookie season)...Just his second start this season in which he's failed to record at least one strikeout.
- In last start, set new career-high allowing a home run in his ninth straight start...Has given up 20 home runs in 21 starts this season compared to just 20 four-baggers in 35 appearances (34 starts) in 2011.
- Has won three of last four home starts, but is 4-6 with a 4.56 ERA at the Big A this season.
- Has thrown quality starts in just 10 of 21 (48%) outings this season...Last season, 26 of 34 starts (76%) were quality starts.
- Left-handed batters are hitting .233 (60/257) against him while right-handers are maintaining a .336 clip (79/235).
- Has received three runs of support or less in 15 of 21 starts this season (4-8 in those starts)...Halos are 8-13 in his starts this season.
- **VS. TAMPA BAY:** Making 13th career start and appearance vs. Rays, second start of 2012...Earned the win in last start, July 27th at Angel Stadium (6 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR)...In 2011, posted a 1-1 record with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 IP – 4 ER)...Owns a 7-3 career record with one complete game and a 2.60 ERA (83 IP – 24 ER)...Over 12 career starts, has limited Rays batters to a .202 batting average (62/307) while striking out 80 batters and walking just 10.
- Struck out Michael Saunders looking in eighth inning of May 24th start for 1,500th career punch out...Is one of 22 active Major Leaguers to reach the plateau.
- In career, has walked just 1.90 batters per nine innings, placing second among active pitchers behind Roy Halladay...In 2011, walked only 33 batters in 34 starts...Has tallied 33 walks in 21 starts this season.
- Has thrown 215+ IP in seven consecutive seasons, the longest active streak in the Majors (ranks first during that span with 173 quality starts).
- Owns an 115-93 career record with 15 complete games, five shutouts, and a 3.66 ERA (1825 IP – 743 ER) in 287 appearances, 277 starts.

- Recorded 14th save Tuesday, his first since August 4th and just his third since the All-Star break.
- Owens a 1.02 ERA (17.2 IP – 2 ER) at the Big A...Limiting opposing batters to a .109 average (6/55) at Angel Stadium with 30 strikeouts.
- Recorded at least one strikeout in 33 of 37 outings since joining club, fanning batters at a rate of 14.9 per nine innings pitched (61 SO – 36.1 IP).
- Has registered 14 saves in 15 opportunities (leads club)...Sole blown save came August 1st at Texas...Angels are 33-4 when he pitches.
