LOT'S OF GREEN & GOLD

The Mariners and A's have shared a lot of "Opening Day" festivities this year...two teams opened Cactus League play March 2 in Phoenix, ...Season Opener in Japan March 28...the 2012 re-opener April 6 in Oakland, and now the Mariners home opener in Seattle.

NOW BATTING 3RD

Ichiro has started all 8 games as the Mariners No. 3 hitter in the lineup...entering this season had made 1,720 of 1,733 career starts at leadoff.

THE ROSTER

The current roster includes 12 pitchers, 3 catchers, 7 infielders and 3 outfielders... 3 players are also on the DL (Mike Carp, Franklin Gutierrez, Adam Moore)...the youngest player on the roster is RHP **Erasmus Ramirez** (5/2/90) at 21 years, 11 months+...the oldest is OF **Ichiro Suzuki** (10/22/73) at 38 years, 5 months+...**13 of the 25 active players have less than one year of MLB service time.**

ROOKIES ON PARADE

The Mariners current roster features 7 rookies: RHP **Steve Delabar**, RHP **Hisashi Iwakuma**, LHP **Lucas Luetge**, RHP **Erasmus Ramirez**, C/DH **Jesus Montero**, INF **Alex Liddi** & INF **Munenori Kawasaki**... last season the Mariners used 12 rookies, and had a club-record 12 players make their MLB debut.

ON THE AIR

Mariners will again use a rotation of announcers this season, all former partners of HOF announcer Dave Niehaus...**Rick Rizzs**, **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** will work nearly all the games, while Ron Fairly, Ken Levine, Ken Wilson, Dave Valle, Dave Henderson, Jay Buhner and Dan Wilson will mix in...**Rizzs** and **Dan Wilson** will be in the radio booth this series, with **Sims** and **Blowers** calling the action on TV.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners (4-4) return home to host the Oakland A's in the first of a three-game weekend series at Safeco Field...Mariners also host Cleveland (3 G) and Chicago-AL (3 G) to kick-start the home schedule in a 3-team, 9-game, 10-day homestand...the Mariners just returned from a six-game road trip where they went 3-3 against the A's (2-0) and Rangers (1-3)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT Sports in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

SEATTLE LID LIFTERS...the Mariners play their 36th home opener tonight vs. the A's...Seattle is 21-14 (.600) all-time in the first home game of the season, the 3rd-best home opener winning percentage in baseball (see list at left)...have won 3 of last 5 home openers, 6 of last 11, and 6-6 in home openers at Safeco Field (since 2000)...also 6-4 in home openers when not opening the season at home...marks the second consecutive home opener to be played at night (previous before '11 was in 2001)...is 16-9 in night home openers, 5-5 during the day...8th time to host the A's in a home opener (5-2, last: 4-0 loss in '10)...5th Friday home opener (1-3).

HOME OPENER HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners host the A's in the home opener at Safeco Field tonight (7:10 pm)...here are some highlights of the festivities surrounding the 36th home opener:

- The first King's Court of the season is **sold out** as **Felix Hernandez** takes the mound.
- Opening Night festivities start at 4:40 pm when the gates of Safeco Field open to the general public with a special countdown at the Home Plate Gate...pre-game festivities begin at 6:30 pm.
- The National Anthem will be performed by **Anna Graceman**, a 12-year old singer/songwriter from Juneau, Alaska...Anna was a finalist on America's Got Talent and is a YouTube sensation.
- A game ball has made a trip around the Northwest where it has been photographed in well-known locations and with noted residents of the region.
- The annual run-around-the bases will be by Make-A-Wish recipient **Olivia Hanstad** of Mt. Vernon.
- Former Mariners outfielder **Mike Cameron** will throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

ODDS AND ENDS...the first 11 games of the season will be against AL West division teams (7 vs. OAK, 4 vs. TEX)...Mariners are batting .277 (59x213) over the last 6 games (hit .174 in Japan).

- The Mariners finished spring training with a 16-9-1 record (.635), the 12th winning spring in club history...3rd-best spring winning pct in club history...see more spring highlights on pgs. 9-10.
- The Mariners bullpen has allowed 8 HR in 8 games...led the AL for fewest HR allowed last season (32).
- **Munenori Kawasaki**, **Lucas Luetge** and **Erasmus Ramirez** have made their MLB debuts this season.
- **Erasmus Ramirez** made his MLB debut at 21 years, 343 days 4/9 at Texas...youngest Seattle pitcher at the time of his debut since Ryan Feierabend (21.022 on 9/13/06) and 17th-youngest in club history...was the youngest player on any MLB Opening Day roster.
- **Batting Around** -- Sent 10 batters to the plate in the April 7 at OAK (4th) & April 9 at TEX (1st).
- **Spreading the Wealth** -- 4 different pitchers have recorded a win, and 4 have recorded a loss.
- **Opening Day** -- Seattle has won 6 straight season openers, tied for the longest active streak in MLB.
- **Felix Hernandez** is 5-0, 1.77 over his last 5 home starts vs. the A's...7-2 all-time at home vs. A's.

SEATTLE VS. ATHLETICS...tonight is already the fifth (3-1) of 19 games between the Mariners and A's in 2012...the Mariners and A's split a pair of games to open the season in Japan (March 28-29), and Seattle swept a two-game series to re-open the season April 6-7 in Oakland...Seattle is 56-43 vs. Oakland since 2007 (30-19 at home)...Mariners trail the all-time series 220-293, including a 125-129 mark in Seattle (64-76 at Kingdome, 61-53 at Safeco Field).

WHAT A LONG, STRANGE TRIP IT WAS...the Mariners opened spring training a week before every other MLB team, with pitchers and catchers reporting to Peoria, AZ on Feb. 11...the Mariners finally returned to Seattle last night after playing 26 spring training games, 2 exhibition games in Tokyo and 8 regular season games (including 2 in Japan)...the club has already traveled over 15,000 miles through the air, including 11,500 miles round-trip to Japan and nearly 3,800 miles on the recent road trip from Phoenix-Oakland-Dallas-Seattle.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...the Mariners roster was the 2nd-youngest among American League teams, and 4th-youngest in the Majors on Opening Day...according to STATS Inc., the Mariners had an average age of 28.33 when the Opening Day rosters were set, trailing only Kansas City (27.42), Houston (27.82) and Atlanta (28.27)...the Mariners 40-man roster was the 2nd-youngest among AL teams, and 3rd-youngest in the Majors at 26.96, trailing only the Royals (26.83) and Astros (26.87).

PARASKAVEDEKATRIAPHOBIA...the Mariners are 10-22 all-time on Friday the 13th (including postseason, 9-21 regular season)...Seattle has dropped 4 of its last 5 games on Friday the 13th...Seattle has played Oakland three times when the 13th falls on a Friday, losing all three games...the Mariners have had one previous Friday the 13th home opener, losing 15-7 to the A's on April 13, 1990...also play the Rangers on Friday the 13th in July in the first game after the All-Star break.

MONTERO'S STREAKING...**Jesus Montero** has recorded a hit in 6 of his 7 games as a Mariner, including a current 6-game hitting streak (.333/7x21)...during his limited Major League career, Jesus has recorded at least one hit in 18 of 25 games.

AS YOU PROBABLY KNOW...**Felix Hernandez** is making his third start of the season, and his third start vs. the Athletics...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...he is the first pitcher to make the first three starts of a season vs. the same team since Kevin Brown for the Yankees vs. Tampa Bay in 2004... he is the second Mariners pitcher to make three consecutive starts vs. the same team, joining Tom House, who made his first three starts of the 1978 season vs. the Twins.

ABOUT FELIX...25-year-old right-hander is making his 3rd start of the season & the 208th of his ML career tonight vs. the Athletics.

- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84...Rijo was 19 years, 54 days old on July 6,1984 (NYY at MIN) in relief appearance.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002.
- Selected to AL squad in 2009 & 2011 All-Star game.
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young Award, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joining Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young ... named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 168 of 207 GS (81%), including 88 of last 94 starts (94%)...2 of 2 in 2012...29 of 32 (91%) in 2011.
- Is 15-8, 2.97 ERA (68 ER, 206.0 IP) with 196 strikeouts in April.

LAST TIME OUT...received ND in Mariners 3-1 win in 11 innings on Opening Day in Japan on March 28 vs. OAK (8.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 6 K)...allowed just a fourth inning run on Kurt Suzuki 2-out double...retired the last 6 A's he faced.

BIRTHDAY BOY...turned 26 April 8...among pitchers through their age-26 season (computed age on June 30th), already ranks 10th in strikeouts...if he strikes out 200 this year, will move up to 6th, passing **Fernando Valenzuela** (1464), **Christy Mathewson** (1376), **Hal Newhouse** (1296) & **Bob Feller** (1292)...210 strikeouts behind **Don Drysdale** (1487) for fifth...**Bert Blyleven** (1728), **Walter Johnson** (1686), **Sam McDowell** (1663), **Dwight Gooden** (1541).

SPRING TRAINING...was 3-2, 3.68 ERA (9 ER, 22.0 IP) with 23 strikeouts in four Cactus League starts...in last appearance on April 2 vs. COL (4.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R/ER, 0 BB, 6 K).

OPENING DAY...made his 5th Opening Day start in Tokyo...also had Opening Day starts: April 1, 2011 at Oakland (W, 9.0,5,2,2,0,5,HR)...April 5, 2010 at Oakland (ND, 6.2,3,3,3,6,4)...April 6, 2009 at Minnesota (W, 8.0,5,1,1,3,6) and April 2, 2007 vs. Oakland (W, 8.0,3,0,0,2,12)...is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (7 ER, 39.2 IP) in 5 career OD starts.

2011 RANKS...ranked amongst AL starters in Complete Games (5, T2nd), Strikeouts (222, 4th), Innings (233.2, 6th), Starts (33, T6th), K/9.0 IP (8.55, 7th), Quality Starts (22, T7th), ERA (3.47, 16th) & Wins (14, T13th).

FOUR IN A ROW...named Mariners MVP pitcher by Seattle chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America...4th consecutive year to win the award.

THREE OF A KIND...first pitcher in club history with 3 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011) with at least 30 starts, 200 strikeouts, 200.0 innings and an ERA under 3.50...combined to go 46-31 with a 2.73 ERA (219 ER, 722.0 IP) and 671 strikeouts over the last 3 seasons.

JOINING ELITE COMPANY...recorded 3rd consecutive 200-strikeouts season (222 in '11, 232 in '10, 217 in '09)...3rd pitcher in club history with 200 K's in 3 straight seasons: Randy Johnson (5 straight, 1991-95) and Mark Langston (3 straight, 1986-88)...one of only 2 pitchers over the last 20 seasons with a trio of 200-strikeout seasons at 25 years or younger (Kerry Wood — 1998, 2001, 2002)...he is the first pitcher since Roger Clemens (1986-88) to record 3 consecutive 200-strikeout seasons through age 25 season (computed on 6/30).

2011 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...

- Tied career-high with 13 strikeouts May 22 at San Diego...4th pitcher in club history (6th time) to record 13 or more strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk; first since Randy Johnson on June 24, 1997 vs. Oakland (19 K's, 0 BB).
- Recorded career W#77 June 2 vs. Tampa Bay, setting franchise record for wins by a RHP (passing Freddy Garcia).
- Recorded 9 strikeouts Aug. 31 vs. LAA to move into 2nd place (1,264) in club record books for strikeouts (passing Jamie Moyer).
- Led AL with 7 starts with 10 or more strikeouts (16 in his career).
- Had three starts w/ 10+ strikeouts & zero walks (5/22 at SD - 13 K, 7/5 at OAK - 10 K, 8/7 at LAA - 12 K) to tie single-season club record with Randy Johnson (1995)...only pitcher with multiple (3) starts with 10+ strikeouts & zero walks.
- Elected to play in his 2nd All-Star game (also: 2009), but did not participate due to starting final game before break vs. LAA.
- Lasted at least 6.0 innings in 30 of 33 starts (22 quality starts)...had string of 30 straight starts of at least 6.0 IP (dating back to 5/13/10) snapped April 16 at Kansas City (5.0 IP), 3rd-longest streak in club history.
- Left final start Sept. 24 at Texas after being hit by a line drive on his right forearm (3.1 IP)...snapped a streak of 23 straight 6.0+ IP starts, May 17-Sept. 18.

2012 SPRING TRAINING REVIEW

WINNING WAYS...the Mariners finished their 36th spring in the Cactus League with a 16-9-1 record...recorded back-to-back winning springs (went 16-13-2 in '11) for first time since a three-year streak from 1997-99...12th spring overall with a .500 or better record (2012, 2011, 2004, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1994, 1993, 1991, 1989, 1988, 1984)...3rd-best spring winning percentage in club history trailing only 1994 (21-9/.700) and 2004 (18-10-1/.638)...finished T2nd in the Cactus League standings, a half game behind the A's, and T4th among AL teams in the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues.

SAYONARA...the Mariners had an unusual spring, playing 21 Cactus League games before packing their bags and heading to Japan to open the 2012 regular season with a pair of games vs. the A's...in addition to the two games vs. the A's in 2012 Japan Opening Series, Seattle also played a pair of exhibition games against the Hanshin Tigers & Yomiuri Giants...the Mariners went 0-2 in the exhibition games, and 1-1 vs. the A's.

GETTING OFFENSIVE...Seattle led all MLB teams with a .297 spring batting average (269x907, 2B - 55, 3B - 11, HR - 28)...also led the American League spring circuit in on-base percentage (.362), slugging percentage (.474), OPS (.836) and runs per game (6.23).

KAWASAKI WINS BATTING TITLE...**Munenori Kawasaki** won spring batting title, leading both the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues with a .455 batting average (20x44, 2B, 3B, 13 RBI)...also ranked 2nd in on-base percentage (.489)...he finished the spring on a tear going 12-for-19 (.632) with 5 RBI over his final five games.

BALANCED POWER...the Mariners hit 28 home runs, with 17 players hitting at least one longball...**Carlos Peguero** (5 HR), **Kyle Seager** (4 HR), **Miguel Olivo** (2), **Jesus Montero** (2 HR), **Vinnie Catricala** (2 HR) and **Ichiro** (2 HR) all recorded multiple homers in Cactus League play...Peguero was T8th in the Cactus League in HR.

RED HOT ICHIRO...**Ichiro** finished the spring with 13 hits in his last 27 at-bats (.481), and batted .415 (17x41) with 2 home runs and 9 RBI in 13 Cactus League games...marked Ichiro's 12th spring training with the Mariners (since 2001), and he is a career .339 hitter (234x690) in spring play.

BIG ROSTER...the Mariners used 88 players during Cactus League play, including 36 pitchers and 52 position players...the 88 players used are the 2nd-most in club spring history, trailing only 89 in 2006...the 52 position players are the most in club history, surpassing the 50 used in 2003.

HOPE YOU ENJOY THE VIEW...The City of Peoria -- joined by representatives from the Mariners, Padres, Cactus League and AZSTA -- announced on March 5 that the city and the two teams have extended their agreement to play in Peoria...the Mariners began training in Peoria in 1993, and now plan to stay at least an additional 20 years...renovations of the Mariners clubhouse space will begin after the spring of 2013, to be completed by spring of 2014.

DOWN ON THE FARM...the Mariners four minor league affiliates compiled a 31-14-3 record in spring training play...the organization also recognized RHP **Brandon Maurer** and OF **Guillermo Pimentel** with the "C the Z" Awards (Control the Zone), and C **Carlton Tanabe** with the SEATTLE Award (awarded annually in spring training to the minor league player that exemplifies the qualities of Skill, Effort, Attitude, Tenacity, Teamwork, Loyalty and Enthusiasm).

TOP PROSPECTS...the Mariners opened camp with five players listed on *Baseball America's* annual list of top 100 minor league prospects -- **Jesus Montero** (#6), **Taijuan Walker** (#20), **Danny Hultzen** (#21), **James Paxton** (#52) and **Nick Franklin** (#77)...the Mariners were also ranked 6th by *Baseball America* in the annual organizational rankings, up from 18th in 2011...the five players were also listed on MLB.com's list of top 100 prospects -- Montero (#12), Hultzen (#16), Walker (#18), Franklin (#52), Paxton (#77).

ATTENDANCE MARKS...the Mariners topped 100,000 fans in home Spring attendance for the 9th consecutive spring...despite being limited to 13 home dates by international travel and a rainout, Seattle drew 102,681 fans to the Peoria Sports Complex...the Mariners and Angels were the only two AL clubs in the Cactus League averaging above 7,600 fans per game...overall, Seattle finished 7th in Cactus League average attendance (only games played in AZ), trailing San Francisco (12,361), Arizona (11,679), Colorado (10,698), the Angels (10,202), the Cubs (9,836) and the Dodgers (8,118) despite having missed a prime weekend while in Japan.

SPRING ODDS AND ENDS...

- The Mariners opened camp with 67 players on the roster (40 roster players, 27 non-roster players)...INF **Carlos Guillen** retired from baseball on March 6.
- **Alex Liddi** was named the Peoria Sports Complex Rookie of the Year after batting .370 (17x46, 13 R, 7 2B, HR, 11 RBI).
- **Felix Hernandez** went 3-2, 3.68 (9 ER, 22.0 IP) in 5 starts and was T9th in the Cactus League with 23 strikeouts.
- **Kyle Seager** ended the spring with a 8-game hitting streak (.400/12x30)...overall hit .360 (18x50, 12 R, 4 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 7 RBI) in 15 Cactus League games.
- **Jesus Montero** tied for the team lead with 13 RBI (with Kawasaki/Peguero), batting .326 (14x43) with 5 extra base hits (2B - 3, HR - 2) in 13 games.
