THE LATEST: Tonight, Angels play the fourth game of a 10-game (2-1) road trip against three of the A.L.'s top teams: **Texas** (2-1), **Chicago** (8/3-5) and **Oakland** (8/6-8)...Last night's 11-10, 10-inning loss marked the second time this season the club has surrendered a six-run lead and lost (also, April 12 at Minn.)...LAA is 4-4 in last eight games and 9-10 since the All-Star break, finishing 14-12 in July (3rd consecutive winning month)...Since April 28th, Halos are 51-34, best record in A.L. in the span...LAA is 39-24 over last 63 contests (18-24 over first 42 games)...Following this road trip, 29 of Angels' next 44 games will be at Angel Stadium.

EXTRA TOUGH: Yesterday was the first time the Angels lost a game in which they held a three-run lead in extra innings since July 10, 1986 at Boston. The Angels scored 3 in the top of the 12th, Red Sox rallied for 4 in bottom half. The game ended on a walk-off balk by Todd Fischer to bring home Dwight Evans with the winning run.

PRIZED TROUT: Today, Mike Trout (.392, 32 R, 10 HR, 23 RBI) was named **A.L. Player of the Month and A.L. Rookie of the Month** for July...Trout is the first A.L. player ever to win Player of the Month & Rookie of the Month in the same month...This marks Trout's third consecutive monthly rookie honor...Only other player to win three straight Rookie of the Month awards was Ichiro Suzuki in April, May & June 2001.

WHAT A MONTH: With 32 runs scored last month, Trout tied Hal Trosky (CLE, 1934) for the all-time MLB rookie runs record for July (32)...Trout set the A.L. record for July home runs (10) by a rookie and tied the Angels' club record for rookie HRs in any month by Wally Joyner in May 1986...Only two rookies in MLB history have had at least 10 HR and 30 runs - Frank Robinson w/ Reds in August 1956 (11 HR, 33 runs) and Luke Easter with Indians in June 1950 (11 HR, 30 runs)...Trout's .804 slugging pct. in July led the Majors.

FLYING MACHINE: Last night marked Albert Pujols' 44th career multi-HR game and second such game in as many days (4 HR total)...First time in his career he has multi-HR efforts in consecutive regular season games...Albert has seven home runs in his last nine games in Arlington (including playoffs)...Pujols has 467 career home runs, good for sole possession of 31st on all-time HR list...With four RBI last night, he is at 1,400 career RBI, just the fourth player in MLB history to reach 1,400 RBI in his first 12 campaigns (Joe DiMaggio, Al Simmons and Lou Gehrig)...Pujols is the first Angel with consecutive multi-HR games since Vladimir Guerrero in 2007 (ESPN STATS).

FAST FACT: Pujols has more career home runs (7) vs. Ryan Dempster than any other pitcher during his career.

UP NEXT - @ CWS: 2012 series is tied 1-1...Angels swept CWS in last three-game series at US Cellular (April 15-17, 2011)...Halos have won seven of last 10 overall games vs. CWS...Sox have slim lead in all-time series (343-346).

MIDWAY MEN: In his first 81 games, Mike Trout scored 80 runs...With 55 RBI, he is responsible for 135 runs plated in 81 games...The last players with 80+ runs and 55+ RBI in their first 81 games of a season were Todd Helton (82, 70) and Alex Rodriguez (82, 74), both in 2000...The last rookie to do this was Joe DiMaggio (87, 83) in 1936 (ELIAS)...Only one other player since 1920 has had as many hits (116), RBI (55) and SBs (31) in his first 81 games of a season as Trout has had through his first 81 - George Sisler in 1922 (ELIAS).

JUST THE TWO OF US: Trout is just the second player in MLB history to hit .350 or above with at least 15 HR and 30 SB before Aug. 1...He ended the month batting .353 with 18 HRs and 31 SBs...Rickey Henderson (1985) is only other player to do so (.352, 16 HR, 47 SBs)...ELIAS.

ROOK OF AGES: LAA was 6-14 when Trout joined team on April 28th, the club is 51-34 since to lead the A.L....He leads A.L. rookies in every offensive category...Since May 1st, the 20 year-old leads MLB with 116 hits, 81 runs scored (19 multi-run games) and times on base (152)...Trout is averaging .99 runs per game played - only two qualifying players in their age-20 season (or younger) have ever finished a season with a run-scoring rate at least as .95 runs per: Alex Rodriguez in 1996, and John McGraw in 1893...Trout scored a run in 15 consecutive games (July 5-23)...The streak tied the modern MLB rookie record set by Roy Hartsfield (2B) with the Boston Braves in 1950 (ELIAS) and set a new A.L. rookie mark...The streak also established an Angels' franchise record...Trout is currently leading the A.L. in batting average (.348) and stolen bases (31)...Only two players in the last 63 years have done so in a season: Ichiro Suzuki in 2001 and Jackie Robinson in 1949...No MLB player has ever had a .340 BA, 20 HR, 40 SB in one season, all within reasonable reach for Trout (ESPN STATS)...Trout has stolen 22 consecutive SBs to match the club record by Gary Pettis in 1985.

CUBAN MISSILES: On Monday, Kendrys Morales became just the third player in MLB history to homer from both sides of the plate in the same inning when he did so in the sixth frame (2-run & slam)...The other are Carlos Baerga (CLE, 1993) and Mark Bellhorn (BOS, 2002)...Morales became first Angel in club history with six RBI in a single frame (1 RBI shy of A.L. record) and the second Halo ever with two home runs in one inning (Rick Reichardt, 4/30/66).

@ TEXAS: Angels have 10 HRs thru first three games of series (most HRs in any series this season), also matches most HRs in any three-game span this season...7 games remain between these clubs (three in Anaheim)...Over the last four seasons (2009-12), LAA is 13-21 in Arlington...Angels lead 2012 series 7-5, outscoring Rangers' 34-15 in last four victories...Halos have won six of last nine meetings...These two clubs have combined for the last five A.L. West crowns (LAA; 2007-09 & Texas; 2010-11)...From 2005-08, Angels held a 48-28 advantage over Texas...Since 2009, Rangers lead series 38-31...The clubs have met 612 times all-time (Halos lead 320-292).

GETTING GREINKE: On July 27th, the Angels acquired Zack Greinke from Milwaukee in exchange for INF Jean Segura, RHP Ariel Pena and RHP Johnny Hellweg. Greinke, 28, was 9-3 with a 3.44 ERA (123 IP – 47 ER) in 21 starts with Milwaukee. He won the 2009 A.L. Cy Young going 16-8 with six complete games, an A.L.-leading 2.16 ERA (229.1 IP – 55 ER) and 242 strikeouts...Angels' rotation features five pitchers that have all been All-Stars (Weaver – 3; Haren – 3; Wilson – 2; Greinke – 1; Santana – 1).

POWER POINTS: Angels' 40 HRs last month were most in July since a club-record 47 HRs in July of 2000...Over the last two-plus months (since 5/22), Angels lead MLB in average .284 (602/2120) & runs scored (331) and rank second in SLG (.468)...Since June 24th, Halos also lead A.L. in OBP (.349)...LAA has 10 or more hits in 51 of 105 games (56 such games in '11)...Halos currently rank 2nd to Texas (.275) in A.L. batting .270.

FROM THE START: LAA starters rank third in A.L. in ERA (3.97), fourth in innings pitched (644.1) & second in BAA (.248)...56% of Halo outings (58/105) have been quality starts...LAA boasts an MLB-best 14 shutouts.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP C.J. WILSON

9-7, 2.88

In search of first win since July 26th and first career road victory in Arlington

- Winless in last six starts (0-3) with last win coming June 26th at Baltimore...Four of last five starts and 11 of last 13 have been quality starts.
- With next victory, will have recorded three straight seasons with 10+ wins, becoming just the fourth pitcher in MLB history to roll of three straight 10+ win seasons after logging three consecutive double-digit save seasons (Derek Lowe, John Smoltz, Ryan Dempster).
- **Has allowed two earned runs-or-less in 11 of 13 road starts, posting a 1.62 ERA (66.2 IP – 12 ER) in those starts...Owns a 2.70 mark away from the Big A.**
- Posted a 0-3 record in July, marking the first time in his career going winless in a calendar month.
- Took the loss in last start despite allowing just two earned runs over six innings...Marked first team shutout with Wilson pitching and fourth time in last five games he has received three runs of support or less.
- Among league leaders, ranks first in road ERA (2.70), fourth in average against (.215), sixth in ERA and eighth in innings pitched
- **VS. TEXAS:** Making fourth career start vs. former team, third start in Arlington...Tossed six shutout innings vs. Rangers in last start, June 2nd at Angel Stadium, but did not record a decision...Is 0-1 lifetime with a 4.50 ERA (12 IP – 6 ER)...Owns an 0-1 record with a 9.00 ERA (6 IP – 6 ER) in Arlington as a visitor...Originally drafted by Rangers in fifth round of 2001 draft...Spent seven big league seasons with Texas compiling a 43-35 record with six CG, one SHO and a 3.60 ERA.
- Finished first-half at 9-5 with a 2.43 ERA, nine wins matching most first-half wins in his career (also 2011)...Selected to second consecutive All-Star game but bowed out due to blister on middle finger of pitching hand.
- Recorded 50th career win, June 8th at Colorado, becoming just the sixth active pitcher with 50+ wins and 50+ saves.
- Made back-to-back starts, May 11-12 at Texas, becoming first Major League pitcher to make starts in consecutive games since Aaron Myette (TEX), Sept. 3-4, 2002 (ejected from first game after two pitches).
- On May 22nd at Oakland, combined with Ernesto Frieri for the eighth combined one-hitter in Angels history, first since Jerome Williams and Jordan Walden accomplished the feat on September 7, 2011.
- Finished 2011 season 16-7 with three CG, one SHO and a 2.94 ERA in 34 starts for the Rangers...Signed a five-year deal with the Angels, Dec. 9, 2011.
- Since becoming a full-time starter in 2010, has compiled a 40-22 record with six complete games, one shutout and a 3.07 ERA (565 IP – 193 ER) in 89 starts.
- Is 52-42 with six complete games, one shutout, 52 saves and a 3.48 ERA (845.2 IP – 327 ER) in 347 career appearances, 95 starts.
- This season, *Smile Generation* will be donating funds to the Angels Baseball Foundation for every strikeout made by an Angels pitcher...They will double that amount when Wilson pitches while also donating to *C.J. Wilson's Children's Charities*.

#49 ERNESTO FRIERI (RHP) *.100 vs. LH, .158 vs. RH* **AGE: 27**

- **Suffered first blown save last night, snapping streak of 12 consecutive saves...Had worked six scoreless innings over first five career outings vs. Rangers.**
- Two home runs allowed last night matched total from previous 41 games (41 IP) combined.
- Has posted a 10.50 ERA (6 IP – 7 ER) in seven appearances since tossing 26.1 scoreless innings in the first half with the Angels.
- Has converted 12 of 13 save opportunities (leads club) while registering seven holds...Angels are 30-3 when he pitches.
- 14 of 15 outings at the Big A are scoreless (had 13 outing (12.1 IP) home scoreless streak snapped Wed. vs. KC)...Has limited opposing batters to a .109 average (5/46) at Angel Stadium while striking out 24 batters.
- Had 26.1 consecutive inning scoreless streak to open Angels career snapped Sunday at Yankee Stadium...Three runs allowed to Yanks also snapped string of 17 consecutive scoreless road outings (17.2 IP) to open season (including time with Padres).
- Tossed 26.1 scoreless innings for Halos in the first half, becoming first Angel reliever in club history to not allow a run before the All-Star break (min. 10 IP).
- Selected as one of five A.L. candidates for the final All-Star roster spot in "Final Vote" campaign, but lost out to Yu Darvish.
- **Leads A.L. relievers with 72 strikeouts.**
- Eighth inning strikeout of Miguel Olivo, May 26th at Seattle, was his 20th in nine innings with 0 hits to start his Angels career...Joined Roger Clemens (1986 & 1996), Kerry Wood (1998) and Randy Johnson (2001) as a member of the 20 K's in 9 innings club, the only difference being that it took Frieri 10 games to do it (*NY Times*)
- Acquired from San Diego, May 3rd in exchange for minor leaguers Alexi Amarista and Donn Roach...Made Angels debut May 5th vs. Blue Jays.
- Third Colombian native to appear with the Halos, joining Orlando Cabrera (2005-07) and Orlando Ramirez (1974-77, '79).
