LEADING OFF: Today LAA plays the final contest of a six-game divisional road trip (2-3) to **Oakland** (2-1) and **Houston** (June 20-22; 0-2)...Last night's 3-2 loss marked 10th time Halos have lost in opponent's last at-bat and just second loss when leading after 8 frames (26-2)...LAA looks to avoid being swept for the sixth time in 2016...Halos are 14-13 against A.L. West foes...LAA is 8-13-3 in 24 series...Club is 7-12 in June (11-13 in April, 13-15 in May)...Angels haven't opened with three consecutive losing months since 2006 (does not include March)...Following this road trip, Angels will host these same teams, **Oakland** (June 23-26) and **Houston** (June 27-29) before heading out on a 10-game East coast road trip to **Boston** (July 1-3), **Tampa Bay** (July 4-7) and **Baltimore** (July 8-10) leading up to the All-Star Break.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Angels' 2016 first round draft pick **Matt Thaiss** (Univ. of Virginia) made his professional debut with Orem last night and went 3 for 5 with two doubles and a three-run, go-ahead HR in the 9th.

SHOE SHINES: Since being recalled from Triple A Salt Lake on May 11th, **Matt Shoemaker** has pitched to a 2.70 ERA (53.1 IP - 16 ER) with 61 strikeouts and five walks.

DID YOU KNOW? The Angels lead the Majors with four (4) players on their 25-man roster from the Pac 12 Conference... Tim Lincecum (University of Washington), Kole Calhoun (Arizona State), CJ Cron (University of Utah) and Jett Bandy (University of Arizona).

JOHNNY B. GOOD: **Johnny Giavotella** had his hit streak to snapped at nine games last night (.412;14/34)..Seven of his 14 hits during the streak went extra bases (3 2B, 4 HR)..He has four home runs in his last eight games...His six home runs are already a career high.

DURABLE DUDES: With **Manny Machado** beginning his suspension Sunday, **Mike Trout** is MLB's active leader in consecutive games started.

TIM TIME: On May 20th, the Angels today signed two-time N.L. Cy Young Award winner **Tim Lincecum** to a 2016 contract. On Saturday, he made his first Major League start since June 27, 2015 vs. Colorado and earned the win (6 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 2 BB, 2 SO)...Lincecum, 32, is one of four pitchers all-time to have won back-to-back NL Cy Young Awards, doing so in 2008 and 2009 and has been named to the N.L. All-Star team four times (2008-11). "The Freak" has tossed two no-hitters: July 13, 2013 at San Diego and June 25, 2014 vs. SD.

HELLO, MY NAME IS...Angels have used 42 players (22 pitchers, 20 positional) this season (**Lincecum** is 42nd) tied with Reds for most in 2016...Club record is 54 players in 2014.

THIS N' THAT: **Kole Calhoun** ranks fifth in A.L. with a .341 (45/132) road clip...Trout leads all A.L. outfielders with 2,324,597 All-Star votes...Halos have hit into 66 double plays (71 G), second-most in MLB...15 pickoffs by Angels' pitching this season leads Majors (no MLB team has more than 9 PO)...Halo batters have fewest strikeouts in all of baseball (430)...Mike Trout is just sixth player since 1901 to log 400 BB and score 500 runs prior to age-25 season: **Mel Ott**, **Mickey Mantle**, **Ted Williams**, **Jimmie Foxx** and **Arky Vaughan**...Angels' current active roster features five players from Venezuela (**J. Alvarez**, **J. Chacin**, **C. Perez**, **G. Petit** and **D. Guerra**).

OAKLAND ON DECK: LAA is 9-2 in last 11 overall matchups with A's (5-1 in 2016, all on road)...Angels have won 13 of last 17 overall games and 22 of last 30 matchups...Halos have won seven of last eight games at Coliseum...LAA claimed 2015 series 11-8 (5-4 on road)... Since 2002, Angels (6) or Athletics (5) have won 11 of 14 A.L. West crowns.

@ HOUSTON: Houston took two of three in first meeting, May 27-29 in Anaheim...Astros lead 2016 season series 4-1... Houston claimed 2015 season series 10-9...**LAA is 15-7 in last 22 home games vs. Astros but 5-13 in last 18 at Minute Maid Park...Pujols' 52 HRs (reg. season only) are most all-time vs. Astros...Seven of last 20 hits for Pujols against Houston are home runs.**

WELCOMED ADDITION: Since May, **Yunel Escobar** is batting .325 (55/169)...**His 82 hits are third-most among A.L. third basemen...His 27 multi-hit games lead Angels...Escobar has an OBP of .360 the leadoff spot (In 2015, LAA leadoff batters posted .280 OBP).**

REHAB UPDATES: RHP **Nick Tropeano** (right shoulder tightness) will start a rehab assignment tomorrow with Inland Empire...**Tyler Skaggs** (shoulder tightness) will pitch in an Arizona League game tonight...**Cliff Pennington** is rehabbing his strained hamstring in Tempe this week...**Geovany Soto** was evaluated after a workout Sunday and could begin a rehab assignment later this week...**Joe Smith** (strained hamstring) has begun throwing from the mound.

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia)...Scioscia's 1,447 wins rank 24th on the MLB all-time list (23rd is Earl Weaver; 1,481).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP MATT SHOEMAKER

3-7, 4.50 ERA

In last six starts, has pitched to a 1.83 ERA (44.1 IP – 9 ER) with 55 strikeouts and two walks

- Making 14th start of the season and eighth at home...Ninth start since being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake...Second start of 2016 vs. Houston.
- **SHOE SHINING:** In last seven starts, is 2-2 with a 2.19 ERA (49.1 IP – 12 ER)...In first six starts of the year, was 1-5 with a 9.12 ERA (24.2 IP – 25 ER).
- **RECORD BREAKING STREAK:** Had streak of 49 strikeouts without a walk snapped on June 11 vs. Cleveland with 7th inning walk to Carlos Santana; established a new Angels franchise record (previously Frank Tanana – 30 strikeouts without a walk in 1976)...Since 1974, his streak ties with Pedro Martinez for third longest in the Majors behind only Curt Schilling (56 in 2002) and Greg Maddux (53 in 2001).
- **RETURN TO FORM:** In last six starts, has recorded 55 strikeouts with two walks, while pitching to a 1.83 ERA (44.1 IP – 9 ER)...Is one of two pitchers in Angels history with no walks in four consecutive starts (also, Bert Blyleven in 1990 – had eight strikeouts in those starts).
- **MORE ELITE COMPANY:** Streak of four straight starts with 6+ strikeouts and zero walks is tied for third longest in Major League history and trails only the five game streaks by Pedro Martinez in 2000 and Curt Schilling in 2002.
- **HALO HISTORY:** Is first pitcher in Angels history with 10+ strikeouts and zero walks in consecutive starts (May 21 and 27)...Became third Major League pitcher this season with 10+ strikeouts and zero walks in consecutive games (Clayton Kershaw and Noah Syndergaard) (ELIAS).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start Friday at Oakland after tossing six innings and allowing two runs (one earned) on six hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.
- **GOING DEEP:** Earned the win May 27 vs. Houston after tossing a career-high 8.1 innings pitched and allowing two earned runs on seven hits...Carried a shutout into 9th inning and exited with one out in ninth and two runners on base (both would ultimately score)...Recorded 11 strikeouts with zero walks.
- **BEATING THE BIRDS:** Tossed 7.1 scoreless innings in start on May 21 vs. Baltimore...Allowed just three hits and no walks while setting a career-high with 12 strikeouts...Became third pitcher in Angels history with 12+ strikeouts and zero walks in a game, joining Frank Tanana (twice) and Dan Haren...Shoemaker joins Haren (5/24/12 at SEA) as only players in franchise history to post those numbers while also not allowing a run.
- **WINNING WAYS:** Earned the win on May 16 at Dodger Stadium...Snapped streak of four consecutive losing starts for LAA
- **WITH THE BEES:** Was optioned to Triple-A on April 30 and made one start for Salt Lake on May 6 vs. Reno...Earned the win after tossing six innings and allowing one earned run on six hits with two walks and eight strikeouts.
- **SCORELESS START:** Earned first win of the season on April 13 at Oakland after tossing six shutout innings and allowing just one hit and three walks while striking out five...Marked 11th career scoreless start of at least five innings pitched.
- **DEFEATING THE DIVISION:** Is 12-8 with a 4.33 ERA (147.2 IP – 71 ER) in 30 career games (25 starts) against A.L. West foes
- **OUT-STANDING:** This season, opponents have batted .205 (18/88) against Shoemaker with two outs, .281 (27/96) with one out and .312 (34/109) with no outs.
- **SUPPORT ME:** Last season, Shoemaker received an average of 3.46 runs of support per nine innings, which was third fewest mark in the American League (min. 125 IP)...In 2014, he led the league with an average of 6.68 runs of support per nine innings (STATS LLC)...In his 12 big league starts this year, Angels have scored just 27 runs while he was in the games.
- **VS.HOUSTON:** In six career games (four starts) against the Astros, is 2-1 with a 4.55 ERA (27.2 IP – 14 ER)...Earned the win in first start against Houston this season on May 27 at Angel Stadium, after taking a shutout into the 9th inning in longest start of career...As a starter, is 2-1 with a 3.70 ERA (24.1 IP – 10 ER).
- **AT MINUTE MAID PARK:** In three career games (one start) in Houston, is 0-0 with a 3.48 ERA (10.1 IP – 4 ER)...Tossed seven scoreless innings in lone start at the ballpark on July 30, 2015.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Owns a 26-21 record and 3.85 ERA (350.1 IP – 150 ER) in 66 games (58 starts) for Angels...Went 16-4 with a 3.04 ERA (136 IP – 46 ER) in 2014 and established a Club record for most wins by a rookie.
