LEADING OFF: Angels play the final game (6-2) of a nine-game homestand vs. **Houston** (2-1), **Seattle** (2-1) & **New York Yankees** (6/29-7/1; 2-0)...**LAA seeks first three-game sweep of Yanks since July 10-12, 2009 at Angel Stadium...Halos have won four straight, five of six and six of last eight games to take over sole possession of second place in division...LAA is a season-best four games over .500 (2nd time 28-24 on 6/1)...Angels are 30-22 in last 52 contests (11-15 first 26 games)...On Friday, the Club opens a nine-game (10-day) road trip to **Texas** (7/3-5), **Colorado** (7/7-8) and **Seattle** (7/9-12) leading up to the All-Star Break.**

NEWS & NOTES: RHP Cam Bedrosian was optioned to Salt Lake last night (corresponding move today)...**Huston Street is two saves shy of becoming 27th player in MLB history to reach 300 saves...**With last night's win, **Mike Scioscia** tied **Davey Johnson** for 28th on MLB's all-time managerial wins list with 1,372...Angels went 14-13 in June, Club has a .500 or better record every month since July 2013 (9-15)...**Halos went an MLB-best 19-8 last July... Matt Shoemaker** has a 2.25 ERA (24 IP - 6 ER) over his last four home starts...**Bullpen ERA of 2.45 (80.2 IP - 22 ER) ranked third in A.L. for June...Five of Angels' last nine games decided by a lone run (LAA is 4-1)...Angels allowed just two hits to NYY last night, fewest since May 23, 1995 (2 hits)...Last night marked third time LAA with back-to-back home runs (Pujols, Aybar) this season; first time since June 7 at Yankees (Trout, Pujols).**

FROM THE START: Halo starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs or less in eight of last nine outings (**two earned or less in seven of last nine affairs & in each of last six appearances**)...**Starters have allowed just eight earned over last six outings (39.2 IP; 1.82 ERA).**

MACHINE'S MONTH: **Albert Pujols** logged 13 HRs in June, matching the Club record for ANY MONTH (also **Mo Vaughn** in May 2000 and **Tim Salmon** in June 1996).

WHAT'S YOUR 20? **Mike Trout** is one of six A.L. players with four 20+ HR campaigns before age-24 season: **Ted Williams** (1939-42), **Mickey Mantle** (1952-55), **Tony Conigliaro** (1964-67), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (1990-93) and **Alex Rodriguez** (1996-99)...**Trout joins Albert Pujols** reaching the 20-homer plateau before All-Star break (just third time in franchise history a pair of teammates hit 20 HRs before the break; **Trout & Pujols** in 2014 and **Garret Anderson, Troy Glaus & Mo Vaughn** in 2000).

****Pujols has also passed Ted Williams, Jimmie Foxx, Willie McCovey & Frank Thomas on the all-time HR list this season...He ranks tied for 29th all-time in RBI (1,652) with Tony Perez...Next up is Sammy Sosa (1,667 RBI)...Albert's 572 career doubles are tied for 23rd all-time with Ivan Rodriguez (Bobby Abreu & Charlie Gehringer are tied for 21st with 574)...Pujols is one stolen base shy of becoming fourth player in MLB history with 500 HRs/100 SBs/.300 Avg. (B. Ruth, H. Aaron & W. Mays).**

MANAGER MINUTE: Since **Mike Scioscia** took over as manager in 2000, the Halos rank third in A.L. in wins (1,372) in behind **Yankees & Red Sox**...**On June 21st, Scioscia** became 11th individual to manage one franchise for 2500+ games.

HOLD ME: **Joe Smith** leads MLB with 22 holds...Smith has appeared in 112 games since joining LAA in 2014 (second-most among A.L. hurlers).

WE LIKE MIKE: **Mike Trout** has garnered 11,461,212 All-Star votes, tops among A.L. outfielders...Seeks his fourth consecutive All-Star appearance and third consecutive start after claiming MVP honors at Target Field in 2014...Trout would join **Reggie Jackson** (1982-84), **Rod Carew** (1979-84) and **Vladimir Guerrero** (2005-07) as the only Angels to earn at least three consecutive fan-elected starts.

DINGER DUO: **Albert Pujols (24 HR, 1st in A.L.) and Mike Trout (20 HR, t2nd in A.L.)** are only teammates in Top 5 in HRs in MLB (**44 combined HRs are MLB's most by a team duo**)...The tandem has homered in the same game 24 times (five times in 2015).

STARTING POINTS: **Halos' 46 quality starts rank tied for second in A.L.**...Angels are 35-7 when holding opponents to three runs or less...**Starter's ERA of 3.87 ranks fifth in A.L.**...LAA starters have allowed most HRs in circuit (62)...**Garrett Richards** has quality starts in 11 of 14 outings in 2015...**Hector Santiago** has allowed **one-or-fewer earned runs in nine of last 14 starts**...Since April 15, he has pitched to a 2.12 ERA (89 IP - 21 ER)...**Santiago** is the lone Halo starter to work at least 5 IP in each start.

TAKE IT TO THE STREET: **Huston Street** is second in A.L. with 23 saves (23/26)...**Since 2011, he leads Majors converting 92% of save chances (149/162).**...On May 13, 2015, Street signed a two-year contract extension through 2017.

COMIN' IN HOT: **Albert Pujols** is batting .310 (35/113) with 16 HRs & 32 RBI his last 31 contests...**Mike Trout** is hitting .349 (29/83) during last 24 games (16 R, 6 HR, 12 RBI)...**RHP Trevor Gott has pitched eight shutout frames to start his big league career...****Erick Aybar** has 14 hits in last 36 at-bats (.389).

OFFENSIVE TIDBITS: **Mike Trout** leads A.L. with 167 total bases...Halo batters have stranded 80 runners last eight games (7 for 66 w/RISP; .106)...51 of Angels' 80 HRs hit are solo (63%)...Angels are 43-9 in last 52 games when **Kole Calhoun** scores a run...**David Freese** has matched his HR total from 2014 (10 in 462 ABs).

KNOW THIS: Angels played their 50th contest under three hours last night (Game #78)...Halos didn't play a 50th such affair in 2014 until Game #139 (9/3/14)...LAA's pitching staff has allowed just 19 unearned runs in 2015 (T4th fewest in A.L.)...**Angels' bullpen ranks fifth in A.L. with 3.23 ERA.**

Making first career appearance vs. Yankees

- Making 15th start of the season and eighth at home...Is in third Major League season (second full year) with Angels...Began season in the Major League starting rotation for first time in career.
- Missed one start while on the bereavement list from April 22-29.
- **DO NOT WALK:** Has issued one-or-fewer walks in 24 of 35 career starts, including 10 of 14 this season...Has 11 career starts with zero walks allowed...**Since start of 2014 season, has averaged 1.76 walks per nine innings (9th fewest in A.L., min. 150 innings pitched).**
- **HEATING UP AT HOME:** Has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (24 IP – 6 ER) in last four home starts with 18 strikeouts and seven walks.
- **HURT BY THE HOMER:** Ranks tied for fifth in the American League with 15 home runs allowed this season...24 of his 47 total runs allowed this season have come via homers.
- **CONSISTENT QUALITY:** Has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 29 of 35 career starts...Has registered a quality start in 18 of those contests.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start Friday vs. Seattle after being charged with two earned runs on seven hits with two walks and two strikeouts.
- **VS. NEW YORK (A.L.):** Today marks first career appearance vs. Yankees...In nine career games (seven starts) against A.L. East opponents, is 7-2 with a 3.40 ERA (50.1 IP – 19 ER).
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 24 career regular season games (19 starts) at the Big A, is 9-8 with a 2.84 ERA (123.2 IP – 39 ER) with 119 strikeouts...This season, is 0-5 with a 4.82 ERA (37.1 IP – 20 ER) in seven home starts...Went 9-3 with a 2.10 ERA (81.1 IP – 19 ER) in 16 games (11 starts) last season at the Big A...As a starter, is 7-7 with a 2.88 ERA (112.1 IP – 36 ER) with 108 strikeouts.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** Owns a 11-2 career record across 18 appearances (16 starts) away from The Big A (4-1 record in seven road starts this season)...Had streak of seven consecutive winning decisions on the road snapped on May 21 in Toronto...**Angels franchise record streak of nine straight wins in his road starts was also snapped in that game.**
- **DRAWING ACES:** Has made 14 career starts (five in 2015) facing off against a former All-Star starting pitcher...**Has a 8-3 record and 2.76 ERA (88 IP – 27 ER) in those contests...**This season, is 2-2 with a 4.26 ERA (31.2 IP – 15 ER) when opposing a former All-Star.
- **STREAKING:** Had career-best streak of winning nine consecutive decisions snapped on April 20 vs. Oakland...During that span, was 9-0 with a 1.92 ERA (61 IP – 13 ER) across 10 games (nine starts), dating back to August 9, 2014.
- **SELECT COMPANY:** Became one of 11 pitchers all-time to earn at least 18 wins through his first 30 career games.
- **ROOKIE RECORDS:** Finished second in 2014 American League Rookie of the Year voting behind **Jose Abreu**...Led all Major League rookies with 16 victories last season...The 16 wins also established a new Angels rookie record.
